#### Editorial

This special news letter is published on the occasion of the holding of the Asia-pacific Regional Microcredit Summit 2008. The regional summit will offer sharing of experiences among over 1000 delegates from 40 countries across the globe. The key agenda of the summit is to review the progress towards achieving the Microcredit Summit Campaign Goal of reaching 175 million poorest with micro credit and ensuring that 100 million poorest move out of absolute poverty measured in US\$1 income level. SDI has been working with its limited capacities to contribute to the achievement of this goal.

However, since the Halifax moot the world economic situation has rapidly started a down ward slide. Instead being able to lift 100 million. people above poverty line, additional 100 million people had sunken below the poverty line. Diverting of food grains for producing bio diesel is held at least 75% responsible for the food crisis.

The challenge of lifting 100 million poor above US\$1 level has become very daunting.

The APRMS2008's importance has increased manifold in the above context. The issue of Climate Change is choreographic all these phenomenon. The whole world's focus is on the APRMS2008 as to what idea and practical action agenda it sets for the

#### Words of felicitation by the MD PKSF for SDI Newsletter

I am happy to know that SDI, a member of PKSF fraternity, is publishing a special supplement of its news letter on the occasion of upcoming Asia Pacific Regional Microcredit Summit (APRMS 2008) that is going to be held in Bali, Indonesia in July 2008. About a decade ago, the practice of this international grand assembly of MFI practitioners had started. With the passage of time, its relevance and importance has been growing in the process of global economic and social development agenda-setting.

The APRMS 2008 is going to be held in the backdrop of a near meltdown of the US financial systems, soaring fuel prices, adverse climate changes and skyrocketing prices of rice and wheat, the cumulative effect being probably that another 100 million people are pushed back into poverty all over the world. Hence the challenges to the MFIs has grown even bigger to bring a growing number poor people within the reach of microfinance.

The clarion call of the Halifax moot was lifting 175 million people above US\$1 a-day income level. The inflation and economic turmoil have made us to think of redefining our goal consistent with the global reality. Bengladesh which is recognized as the flag bearer of the microfinance revolution, may again have to give idea and leadership to confront the challenges.

In this context, it is a very worthwhile exercise on the part of SDI to publish its newsletter during APRMS 2008. The newsletter may provide a glimpse of the working of an ideal MF institution in Bangladesh to an assembly of no less than 2000 microfinance practitioners and researchers as well policy advocates from all over the world.

I hope the newsletter would be able to project to the august assembly of MF practitioners an interesting window to know about SDI's initiatives to achieve the commitment the NGOs had given in Halifax conference in 2006.

Dr. Quazi Mesbahuddin Ahmed Managing Director, Palli Karma Sahayak Foundation (PKSF) SDI commissions Study "
The Impact On Livelihood Of

The study was conducted in the period from October 2007-to Mid march 2008. The major recommendations were that Govt should ensure not only livelihood security of the fishers but also to improve the over all human security and welfare of the community. Dr. Khursid Alam of CODEC and two of his colleagues had jointly conducted the study.

## BTV telecast success story of SDI

SDI activities were highlighted in a popular BTV program SHAFOLLO GATHA presented by Mir Emdad Ali a popular TV presenter.

The TV presenter depicted a gamut of MC related activities of SDI in Dhamrai region of SDI. The 15 minutes long documentary presented the success story of Saleha begum a MC program partner of SDI since 2003. Saleha had to pluck enough courage while she took her first loan of a paltry sum of 2000 taka. But now she borrows in the range of half a lac taka without a frown in her forehead. She has now established a

small dairy with a pair of milk cows, she rears a horde of goats and chickens. In a matter of 3 years she could change her quality of life in a way which has become a model in her village.

The TV show also presented the pottery of Ratan Paul. Ratan Paul produces pottery items like flower vase, ornamented pots, vessels. Ratan is a 'micro entrepreneur' category borrower. He had borrowed taka One\_lac. With this capital he could expand his production capacity and also engage more employees.

## SDI Flood Response in 2007

Bangladesh has suffered recurring flood during the month of July and August of 2007. The floods had affected 34 districts of Bangladesh. Manikganj was among the most severely affected districts. Dhamrai, Ashulia under Dhaka district was also affected by the flood.

SDI has extensive coverage in the Manikganj areas and Ashuila and Savar. About 10,000 beneficiaries of SDI were directly affected by flood.

SDI with its own resources came forward to mitigate the affect of flood among its beneficiaries as well as other afflicted people in the area.

With the outbreak of flood, SDI mobilized relief teams which went round the homes in all the villages where SDI has partner groups with essentials like snake repellant, gentian violet, anti diarrheal, Halogen tablet, ORS, medicines for common cough and cold, antipyretics. SDI

also constructed Sanitary toilets for the families who had taken refuge in high grounds adjacent to the Dhaka-Aricha highway.

SDI dispatched food relief's to remote shoals in the middle of the river Padma in places like



Baghutia, Char Bachamara

As the flood was continuing for more than two weeks, SDI sent two medical team formed with its own health workers, paramedics. The team went round

> shelters opened by the govt and also into various locations in the villages in various unions and opened medical camps. The team treated 3000 sick patients in 8 spots in a period of 15 days.

> SDI relief teams distributed 25000 sachets of ORS, 2200

vials of snake repellant, 1600 bottles of gentian violet, 10,000 halo tabs. Installed 7 units of Sanitary toilets on the road side.

The medical team treated 4234 patients in 24 unions under 5 police stations inside 2 districts

(Manikgan) and Dhaka).

SDI provided food relief also from its own resources and also encouraged Shustho Jibon ( an informal association of morning walkers around Dhanmondi lake) and Leading Business Man like Chittaranjan Majumdar to donate rice,

pulse, salt, biscuits for the flood affected people in the remote place I i ke Char Bachamara and Char Bharanga under Daulatpur upazila in Manikganj.

While providing relief special care was taken to pro-

vide relief to disabled, old people, pregnant women or women with infants, hardcore poor as priority.

5 kg of rice, 1 Kg of pulse and ½ kg of salt were packed in one

pack of food relief. In all 1650 persons which included 96 physically challenged, 110 pregnant women, 188 old people, 50 children and 1206 hardcore poor. The value of the relief food was Taka 3lac+

.Shustho Jiban and Majumdar traders jointly donated taka 5.85 lac worth of rice, pulse salt and biscuits. 15000 Kg of rice, 3000 kg of pulse and 1500 kg of salt and 3000 packs of energy biscuits were distributed among 3000 persons

After the recession of flood SDI undertook rehabilitation work. In total 83 lac taka was distributed among 4150 families. Each family was given taka 2000 with 4% service charge.



This in addition to the normal MC being suspended for 4 our weeks period of flood.

SDI's relief work got wide media coverage in the electronic as well as print media.

### Micro-credit Fair 2008

SDI took part in the Micro-credit fair. Since 2007 PKSF is sponsoring a Micro credit fair in Dhaka as annual fixture in its calendar of events. This years fair was between 5 – 8 march in Bangladesh China Friendship Convention Centre(BCFCC) (in Agargaon. in all 82 organizations participated in the fair. Of which 74 were Micro finance Institu-

tions. The MFIs displayed in their stalls various products produced by the Micro entrepreneurs SUDported by the respective NGO. The list of products on display was quite long and veritable. An impressive array products produced by the MC borrowers were on display. Visiting the stall would give one impression that how dynamic and resourceful are our rural poor are. The mi-

cro credit has given them a fighting chance to win over poverty.

On the sideline of the fair every day a series of seminars were hosted at the conference centre adjacent to the fair premises.

The fair was inaugurated by Dr. Mirza Azizul Islam, finance advisor of the caretaker govt of Bangaldesh. Dr. Fakhruddin Ahmed the Head of the caretaker govt was the chief guest of the concluding session. Dr. Quazi Mesbahuddin Ahmed were the other guests sitting on the podium. In the concluding meeting 3 MFI's were conferred best performer awards in 3 categories.

In the SDI stall SDI MF partners from far



away places like Sandwip were displayed, SDI extends MF service to

Diversified handicrafts products with fine jute such as bags of various shapes and sizes and colors, sandals made of jute drew much interest of fair visitors. Sales of the products were brisk. Quilts with intricate stitch-works portraying traditional rural motifs were on display.

visitors with passion for folk cultural heritage had huge admiration for the rural women producers from Sandwip. SDI MFI program supports legendary Dhakai Benarasee Saree producers in Mirpur. The women with skill of doing 'Karchupi' on Saree (intricate motifs of stitched 'Chumki' inlay in the body and the frills of the sharee) worked in the stall. Visitors could comprehend the

skills and level of perseverance needed to fabricate karchupi on Saree. Sales were brisk for the Saree with karchupi works, jute bags, various vases, pots and holders made of baked clay SDI stall also dispotteries. played brass and bronze metal artifacts produced by entrepreneur women from Dhamrai. She produces show piece objects replicas of curios antiquities like figurines or statuette of Indian mythological gods and goddesses, animals like lion, tiger, horse, owl, flower vases, pots with made of caste brass or bronze metals. The

products on display gave the SDI stall a colorful look. The SDI stall was a popular foray for the lovers of show pieces and specially replicas of art objects of olden times.

SDI installed HDTV monitor TV and played multimedia presentations depicting SDI's programs and activities.

### Rehabilitation of Non-Motorized Transport Pullers and Poor Owners Project (RNPPO)

#### Introduction

This is a project taken by PKSF for which the World Bank has provided the fund. The project would support the non-motorized transport pullers and poor owners who have been affected due to ban of non-motorized transports on some roads of Dhaka city. The duration of the project is from July 2007-June 2009. The World Bank has approved a fund of US Dollar 17.0 million (Tk. 119 crore) for the project. In this regard, an agreement was signed between IDA and Government of Bangladesh on June 21, 2007. PKSF has sanctioned loan of Tk. 271 million in favor of its 10 POs to implement the project.

#### The project goal:

Rehabilitation in alternative vocation of 40500 Non motorized transport drivers and poor owners who were affected by the prohibition of rickshaws on roads sections from Gabtoli to Azimpur.

SDI is implementing the project in Shaymoli, Adabor, Monsurabad housing area among 3099 rickshaw pullers/owners and their family members. The project arranged for vocational training for the affected rickshaw pullers/owners according the options given by the trainees. SDI would be disbursing Tk 8 crore 76 lac through its 2 MC branches

#### Project Objectives:

To improve the quality of life of the targeted people by creating opportunity for employment and or income generation in activities with the exception of rickshaw pulling or non motorized transport driving.

- Employment generation and entrepreneurship promotion through Skill development and imparting training on business development
- Improvement of Social and health awareness
- Augmentation of life-skill of the targeted people

#### Trend of expansion of MF program of SDI for the period from 2004 -2008





#### SDI's Financial and Operational Self sufficiency trend for the period 2004-2008




#### Portfolio quality of SDI MF program over the period from 2004-2008




## Operational efficiency in terms of cost of lending (per Tk.) and total cost per loan unit (taka)



Trend of savings mobilization and landing expansion over the period from 2004 - 2008





#### Loan disbursement, loan units processed over the period 2004-2008

## Comparison of loan outstanding on 1st Jul '07 and on 30 Jul '08









#### Members enlistment target for 2008-2009


#### Advocacy for Bay fisher's safety

## Vegetable cultivation makes Ultra poor to increase income in Sandwip



The IRDP project phase IV hard core poor members are growing vegetables for consumption and for selling too. Under its program for tion, 150 group members were given training on vegetable gardening on small spaces. Bangladesh has two seasons for vegetable cultivation, one in summer and the other in winter. the between during monsoon period is considered a period for major crop cultivation like rice crop.SDI supplied of HYV seeds seeds for eggplant, beans ( winged bean, mung bean). sweet gourd, brinjal, cucumber, radish, spinach to 490

families. Each families were given 50 gms of seeds.

The selection seeds were made considering the lack of land space by the hardcore

income genera- So vegetables which are generally of tion 150 group creeper type were preferred.

Some of the trained poor used their thatched roof to grow creepers and some others used the embankment slopes for planting bean seeds.

All together about 6000 kg. of vegetables were grown by the poor. It was no mean feat on their part, the value in terms taka will be around 75,000 taka in a conservative estimate. The families consumed a quantity of the produce rest they sold to neighbours or in the market.

The earning for individual families were in the range of taka 3000- to taka 5000. The experience was very positively embraced by the hardcore poor. They are now approached SDI extension workers for winter crops.

Among all, Amena Begum of the Timi Mohila Samity, Ferojea Bengum of Gangchil MSS, Rokeya Begum of Icahamoti MSS, Nurjahan Begum and Ambia Begum of Godhuli MSS, Nasima Begum of Moyuri MSS were the most successful vegetable growers. Their success has greatly encouraged others to do their next seasons planting with more intent and earnest

# GAMEBOARD on 4 natural hazards (IEC Package Development for students)



During the 2007-2008 period the project developed DURJOG JOYER LUDO an innovative game board targeting the primary school children studying in class III-V to acquire knowledge of hazards that looms over their communities. 4 hazards that threaten the coastal communities were addressed in the game. The game board has been adapted and developed based on the ISDR's IEC material RISKLAND. The game board is a LUDO/Snake ladder type game board, messages, on DOs and DONTs on the game board are placed under different numerals.

The game board was introduced in 15 primary schools in the high risk belt of Sandwip. 2 teachers from each school were given orientation on the game, its rules and also as to how to satisfy the additional queries of the players and onlookers on various issues dwelt with in the game process how to disseminate disaster risk reduction messages to the primary school students.. An agreement was concluded with the school management for the purpose of ensuring routine and regular use of the game board by the children.
